Kindergarten boys participate in this pilot program with an adult. Emphasis on family skills, service to others, and feelings of self-worth.

CUB SCOUTS:
First - Fifth grade boys. A family and neighborhood centered program with emphasis on social skills and family relationships.



BOY SCOUTS:
Serves boys 11-18 with high adventure, hiking, camping, canoeing, merit badge advancement, and leadership opportunities.

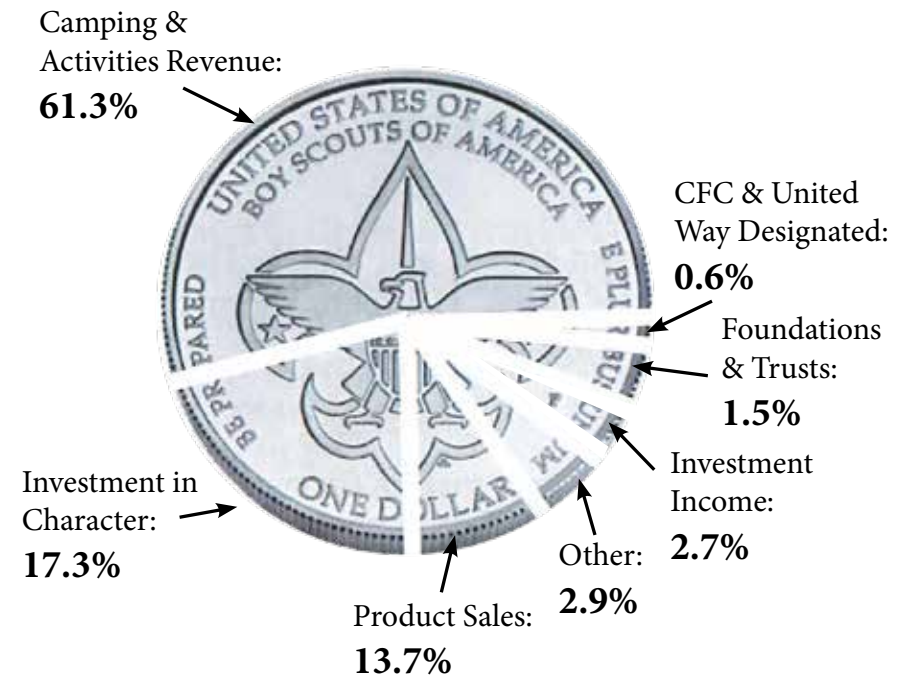
VENTURING:
Targeted to boys and girls 14-20. Offering leadership and high adventure opportunities to senior youth groups.



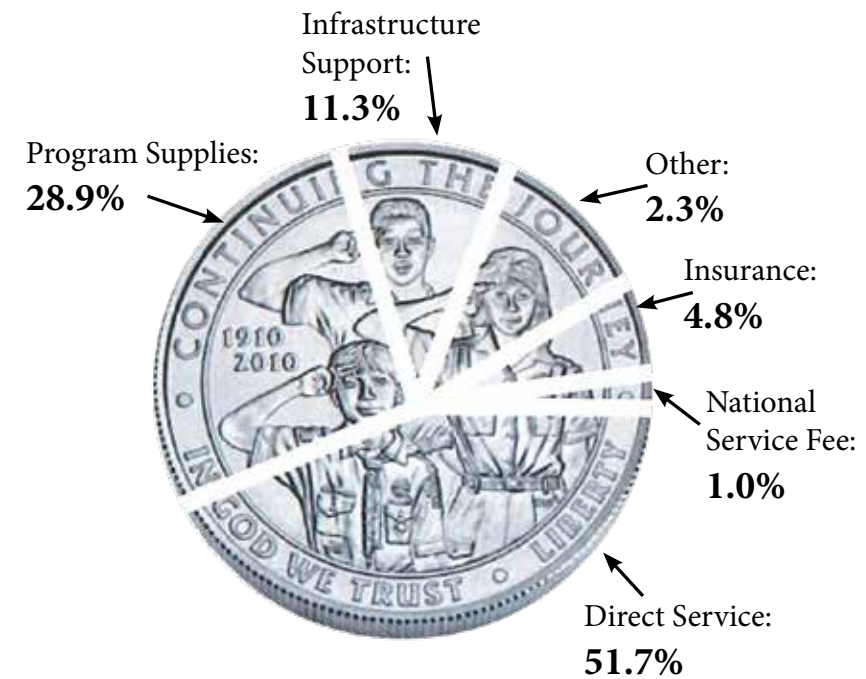
EXPLORING:
